Winchester Lions Hall Will Be Fully Accessible Thanks to \$40,000 OTF Grant

Winchester – The Lions Club of Winchester announced today the start of construction on an accessible ramp and washroom at the Lions Hall for Senior Citizens, thanks to a \$40,000 grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF). Jeremy Gowsell, Constituency Assistant to MPP Jim Brownell, joined OTF volunteer Eldon Horner in congratulating the Lions at the ceremony to kick off the renovations.

Jim Brownell, MPP for Stormont-Dundas-Charlottenburg, was unable to attend and sent his best wishes. “The Lions Hall for Senior Citizens is a great facility that benefits community members,” said Brownell. “These renovations will open up the facility, ensuring that everyone has access.”

The Lions expressed their gratitude at receiving this one-year grant, which will enable them to provide a barrier-free facility. At present, the Golden Years’ Society, the Women’s Institute, People First and North Dundas LEO Club use the hall on a regular basis. Other groups such as the Winchester District Memorial Hospital and the Auxilliary, members of the residents at Dundas Manor and community groups rent the hall on special occasions. Having the hall totally accessible will assist these groups and open it up for increased use from the Nordun Senior Centre next door, which will now be able to apply for grants to run programs at the hall.

The Ontario Trillium Foundation, an agency of the Ministry of Culture, receives \$100 million annually from Ontario’s charity casino initiative. The Foundation allocates grants to eligible charitable and not-for-profit organizations in the arts and culture environment, human and social services and sports and recreation sectors. District A4 Club Renewal Day

The intended purpose of the Club Renewal Day was to allow those Clubs in attendance an opportunity to present some of the challenges they are facing in a informal manner that would stimulate discussion. Much of the discussion centered on the steps that all Lions Clubs should be taking to keeping the members we have, keeping relevant to our communities and attracting potential members into Lionism.

One constant theme was that Lionism can be a life changing experience. The shared experiences that we encounter as Lions are the relationships that we have to our communities. Lions have to educate themselves. They have to be able to speak both comfortably and proudly about what they do and what it really means to them to be a Lion. In the group discussion, it was brought up that all clubs conduct a 'Club Assessment' from time to time to determine how they are performing. Are we providing what needs to be provided to our community? Clubs, and their members need to evaluate themselves and create measurable goals.

Once we have new members we need to properly train them. Through a member orientation clubs can educate both the new Lions and remind some of the long serving Lions of their roles in the clubs, their importance to the community and the meaning of “We Serve”.

One of the greatest challenges that we face as Lions is our inability to exploit our successes. We do a poor job of public and media relations. When planning an event, have a media chair to write the news releases and talk the event up with the local paper and radio!

Why are Lions leaving the Clubs? We cannot loose the Lions we already have. We need to know why members are loosing interest and leaving. Keep the flow of communication open with all members, and for those who do leave for any reason, complete exit interviews. Focus the attention of the club on the three-person membership committee and pursue opportunities for growth, but do not loose sight that we must seek out quality Lions, not simply growth for the sake of growth.

THE KEY TO MEMBERSHIP GROWTH

One of our Past International Directors, Lion Jim Cameron, emphasized that the key to growth is member involvement. He was clearly stating that every Lion has a responsibility for membership growth! I want to take this one step further, by stating it is our ‘Three-Person Membership Committees’ that are tasked with making sure our Lions never overlook this important responsibility. ‘Quality Lions’ and ‘Membership Growth’ are vital to the future of District A4, and I would like to explain more fully the significant importance of our Lions Clubs having energetic Membership Committees in place.

Membership Committees have been an integral part of Lions Clubs for the past seventeen years. At a June 1989 meeting in Orlando, Florida, the International Board of Directors adopted a resolution designed to strengthen every Lions club's drive to build its membership roster. The resolution provided for the establishment by each club of a 'Three-Person Membership Committee' – a Chairperson, a Vice-Chairperson and an Elected Member, with each member elected to a three-year term. In the second year, the Elected Member becomes the Committee Vice Chairperson, and in the third, Chairperson. This rotation system better prepares the Committee Chairperson and ensures continuity of the committee's important work.

Membership Committees, in cooperation with Lions Club's members, are responsible for:

- developing a 'Membership Growth Program' for the club and presenting the plan to the Board of Directors for approval;
- encouraging Lions during meetings to bring new female and male members into the club; and
- scheduling 'Membership Orientation Sessions' and arranging for dignified 'New Member Induction Ceremonies'.

As your Membership Chairman, I am respectfully requesting that all District A4 Lions Clubs make a commitment to strengthening their Club's **Membership Growth, Extension, Retention and Leadership Activities** by forming a 'Three-Person Membership Committee'. For those Lions Clubs who have not yet established this 'Three-Person Membership Committee', I am asking Club Presidents to put one in place and to provide me with the names of their Lions.

Today's Lions are women and men dedicated to making their communities better places to live. The 4th of July 2007, will mark the 20th Anniversary of women in Lions. Yet, less than 15 percent of the approximate 1.4 million Lions worldwide are women. What is wrong with this picture? I have been reminded time and time again that a LION, is a LION, is a LION! But, I still like to emphasize the importance of saying men and women Lions because we must value the contribution of ALL citizens.

The International goal this year, set by International President - Jimmy M. Ross, is for 50,000 new women Lions. As our share of this 50,000 number, what say we establish a Lions Year 2006/2007 District A4 goal of 100 new women Lions! If all our clubs put this goal on their agendas, it should be easy to accomplish!

Because of the high importance that Lions Clubs International places on recruiting both female and male Lions, and to further help clubs in achieving this goal, I would like to make a recommendation that at least one member of your Membership Committee be female. At the enjoyable and informative 'CLUB RENEWAL DAY' that was held at the Cumberland Lions Club, 26 November 2006, MERL Team presenters reviewed and discussed all aspects of **Membership Recruitment, Club Extension, Member Retention and Leadership**. In addition to providing advice and guidance, and listening to the concerns of those in attendance, the MERL Team advised everyone that if asked, they would make themselves available to help clubs in whatever way possible.

Let me say that as your MERL Team - Membership Chairman . . . I am hopeful that every Lions Club in this great District A4 will be engaged in an aggressive recruitment strategy. I truly would like to see our 'Three-Person Membership Committees' as well as each and every one of our Lions recognizing their role, and their responsibility, as potential recruiters of new women and men Lions.

I will close with the inspirational rally call provided by Past International President 'Bill' Biggs . . .

The Chesterville & District Lions Club have brought this young boy up as a zone project for Zone 41 South, and it was accepted without hesitation. We are now asking other clubs in the District to come on board with us.

Caylen who just turned 2 in October, was in a tragic lawn mower accident in May of 2006, and as you can see he has tremendous amount of damage done to the face and arm.

- induced into coma for 2 months because he had lost a piece of his brain. As a result, he came out of it with no brain damage
- lost eye and is waiting to have glass eye put in at present, but as he grows, will need replacements.
- lost his nose and 4 fingers on one hand
- extensive damage to one arm, and lost elbow. Caylen presently goes to the hospital 3 times a week to strengthen this arm
- extensive damage done to the inside and outside of his mouth

- released from hospital in September, 2006 with feeding tube inserted into navel. Surgery on this will be performed sometime in the Spring of 2007 in Toronto

Caylen's costs at this time for cosmetic surgery is estimated at over \$100,000.00 and mouth only is covered by O.H.I.P. the rest is considered cosmetic. As well there will be other expenses while in Toronto for the family to stay and meals. Caylen's father is self-employed and is saving every penny to help Caylen look like a normal boy again.

Our club has applied for an L.C.I.F. grant, but unfortunately has been turned down. This grant does not cover glass eyes and this is why we are asking other clubs to hopefully have Caylen as their zone project. Also Zone 41 South has voted on \$1000.00 this year as an amount to give rather than \$500.00. As well we have done a fundraiser, and have raised \$7,000.00, which you can read on Caylen's web site.

Caylen was seen on the Childrens Miracle Network on December 10, 2006 and also has a web site with pictures and write-ups from local newspapers: Google – Caylen Laberge.
