CANCER TELETHON - 2009

Time is rapidly running out for this venture to get off the ground. To date I am aware of only Clarence Creek, Kanata Hazeldean and Rockland Lions Club that have formally committed funds for the Telethon. (Approximately \$2,000) Several other clubs have indicated that they will be participating, but I have not received anything in writing as to the amounts of their pledges. I have to let the organizers of the Telethon know that the Clubs in A4 have been able to raise sufficient funds to proceed once again with this venture within the next three weeks. Therefore, I am asking once again that your Club consider making a donation to Cancer using this venture that has been so successful in the past. The following is a description of this venture.

Is your Club considering a donation to Cancer this fiscal year? If so would you be willing to do this in time for the Annual Cancer Telethon in Jan 2009 If you are planning on making a donation regardless of the amount I would ask you to join forces with other Clubs in the district and pool the funds so that we could raise a corporate challenge during the Telethon. I have been organizing this for the past six of seven years in the District. So far the Clubs in the district have contributed over \$34,000.00 during the Telethon.

You may ask what is in this for you and your Club. Well if your Club makes a donation to Cancer anytime through the year do you get any publicity for it??. Normally only large donations to Cancer get any publicity. Donations of \$50, \$300, \$500, etc. do not receive much, if any notice.

If you pool your funds with other Clubs in the district this is what the Cancer people are willing to do for us as they have in the past. For one hour during the time of our corporate challenge they give us 10 telephone-answering spots for members in their Lion's vests These members are panned by the TV cameras over and over again during that hour and may be interviewed by the celebrity's. Your Clubs name and the amount of your donation is scrolled across the bottom of the TV screen several times during that hour. The Lions Logo is displayed in the top corner of the screen several times during the hour. Then we get the Corporate challenge time as well where we get a minimum of three minutes of continuous coverage for Lions Clubs. Sometime after the challenge is over there is a separate cheque presentation of the amount pledged, MORE publicity for the Lions Clubs in the district.

I have asked the Cancer Foundation how much money we need to raise to change the corporate challenge to five minutes from three. Don't worry about the challenge amount and our commitment. The Cancer people know in advance just how much money we are committed to match regardless of the total amount that is raised during that time frame.

The first year we did this nine Clubs raised \$5100. In 2007 20 Clubs raised over \$10,000 I think this is a great way for Lions Clubs in District A4 to get some much needed publicity for what we do in the community. In order to do this I need the support of your Club and a written commitment of your donation amount as soon as possible. Cheques can be made out to the "Ottawa Regional Cancer Foundation" and sent to the Rockland Lions Club and I will bring them to the Telethon or they can be made out to the International Association of Lions Clubs District A4 (noted for the Cancer Telethon) and sent to the Cabinet Treasurer.

Since July 2006, it has been a great experience and indeed an honor to have served this great District A-4 as your MERLO Team – Membership Chair. Although my term will come to an end, 30 June 2009, please know that I will make myself available by offering my guidance and assistance to the next man or woman Lion who wishes to take on this important Cabinet post.

During my 3-year tenure as your Membership Chair I have always emphasized that new member recruitment, of both *quality men* and *quality women*, is the number one priority of Lions Clubs International. I have also stated that each and every Lion within this organization is responsible for new member recruitment, and that the focus on membership recruitment needs to be seen as a 365 day-a-year activity.

Here's a great membership idea that you can bring to your next Lions Club meeting. Why not ask two 4th year High School students, (one community minded boy and one community minded girl), to join your Lions Club. Invite them to bring a new idea for a community project that could raise money for one of their school activities. This would be a WIN/WIN membership recruitment tool because not only would your club gain two new young members, but the students would be able to put their volunteer time towards the school's required community service hours.

As you know, I have always emphasized the importance of each one of our A4 Lions Clubs having an energetic and dedicated '*Three Person Membership Committee*' in place and I am pleased to say that this year, the majority of our clubs (61 out of 72) have one. I have asked the Club Presidents of the eleven that do not, to please put one together as soon as possible. If I don't have a Membership Chair contact, I send e-mails directly to the Club Presidents and/or Club Secretaries. When it comes to matters of club membership, no one gets left out of the picture!

Last year, when I conducted Membership Chair sessions at Officer Schools, I shared a lot of important information with those in attendance. For those Lions who were not able to attend, I put everything that was presented on the A-4 Website at: www.a4lions.ca. All you have to do is go to this site and click on 'MERLO Team – Regional Officer School – Membership Chair Presentation'.

In closing, I would like to mention a few things with which I will need your full support and assistance during this Lions Year 2008/2009. So far, our MERLO Team has met three times and we are in the stages of planning an 'A-4 Forum' for early next year. Please put the date, 21 March 2009, on your calendar and make plans to attend. Lion Andy Etherington will be providing more information once all of the details have been finalized.

Anyone who knows me, knows that I beat the drum for women in Lions! Please help me this year by placing more emphasis on recruiting women Lions into our clubs. My A-4 MERLO Team Membership Chair goal for this Lions Year is to bring the percentage of women Lions in the District up to 25 percent. This equates to 150 new lady Lions! As of October 2008, of the 1722 Lions in District A-4, 1429 Lions are men and 293 Lions are women. One statistic that I have been desperately trying to change is this . . . of the 72 District A-4 Lions Clubs there are still approximately 20 clubs who do not have any women Lions? WITH YOUR UNDERSTANDING, COOPERATION AND ASSISTANCE I would very much like to see this statistic change.

Worldwide Induction Ceremony - The last important point I would like to bring to your attention is that I have been asked to chair next year's District A-4 Convention 'Worldwide Induction Ceremony' on the 18th of April 2009 at the Hampton Inn in Ottawa. As a result, I am asking all clubs to keep me informed by providing the names, telephone numbers and e-mails of all your new members and their sponsors. 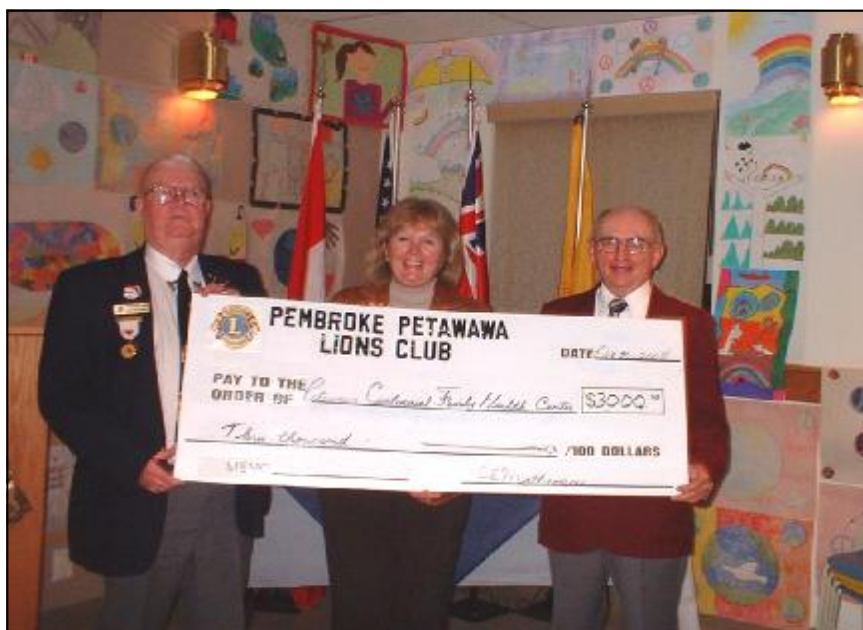

Governor's Welcome and Opening Remarks:

Governor Al welcomed and thanked those attending, and reported on the main aspects of the last MD'A' meeting. He also updated the Cabinet on upcoming operations that will impact the Clubs.

Acceptance of Agenda & Minutes of September 2008 Cabinet Meeting

Moved, seconded and accepted to receive the proposed agenda and the minutes of the September 2008 Cabinet Meeting.

Business Arising from the Minutes

The Cumberland Lions Club may host the Governor's Curling Bonspiel.

Cabinet Secretary's Report:

All committee material has been sent out as requested.

Cabinet Treasurer's Report:

Lion Trevor presented the treasurer's report, with a project account balance of \$17,641. Moved, seconded and Carried.

Reports Under District Governor, the VDG & the Region Chairpersons. The reports have been filed with the original set of these Minutes

Business Carried Over: None.

New Business:

The following financial items were moved, *seconded and approved that* District:

- *purchase 20 English and 5 French Peace Poster kits, and make them available to the clubs at approximately \$12 per kit;*
- *donate \$150 to the MD'A' Effective Speaking program;*
- *provide \$800 for Leo convention participation, at a maximum of \$30 per attendee; and*
- *apply for a LCIF grant to purchase a \$30,000 van for Lake Jo.*

Awards and Presentations:

Lion Andy Etherington reported that Lions members did 492 hours work for the RCMP Sunset Ceremonies, so he presented IPDG Jerome with a pin. Governor Al presented Lion Norm Edwards with a Melvin Jones Fellowship.

The Gov's closing remarks included reciting a Christmas wish poem.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 9:45 P.M.

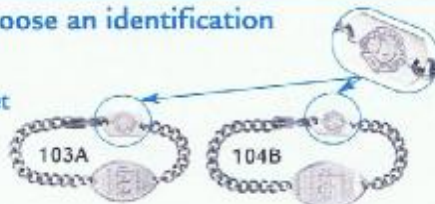

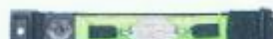
